

2015 ITA Arbitral Award Enforcement Survey

In connection with the upcoming <u>2015 ITA Workshop</u> in Dallas on June 17-19, we are now conducting a survey on the experiences of arbitration practitioners with enforceability of arbitral awards. We write to invite your participation.

As you may recall, last year we launched the 2014 ITA Survey on the Enforcement of Arbitral Awards, and <u>presented our results</u> in Dallas in June 2014. While there were many critical and thought-provoking findings from that trial run, we have updated that survey to make the data captured this year even more useful for practitioners.
